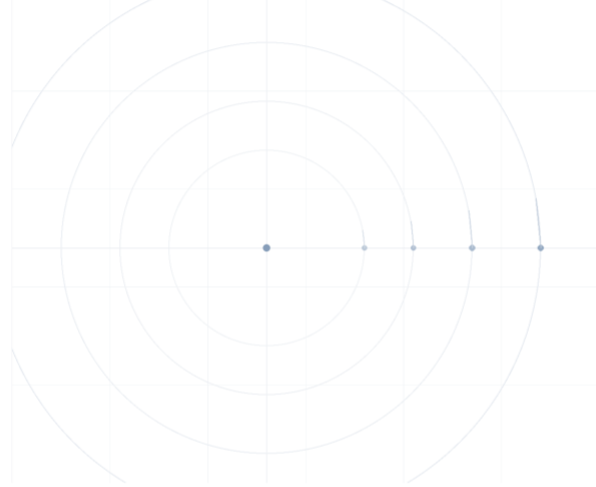


Course Infrastructure Assessment

1. Your Current Stage

Tier 2 — Deployment Ready
